Dear friend,

{This is a message I sent to my close friend who reached out to me questioning her worth because of a challenging situation with a family member. It was in my heart to remind her of who she was in Christ. These words ministered to me as I wrote them. It is a deep work the Lord continues to do in me. The greatest deceptive lie that's whispered to me is that I am not enough, but I have to be reminded that those words are whispered to my flesh.}

"Praying for you that the Lord reveal to you that who you are in Christ is enough! You are enough because your life is now in Him and He has overcome the Enemy's schemes. Our value comes from within not

from our outward circumstances.

It is a LIE that our choices right or wrong determine if we are enough.

It is a LIE that people's opinions of us determine if we are enough.

It is a LIE that our mistakes determine if we are enough.

It is a LIE that our limitations determine if we are enough.

We are full of value because WE BELONG TO AND ARE FOUND IN CHRIST. To hell with anything else! Your identity is already spoken for by your Lord. He is your strength and your sight. You don't have to work to earn it. It is a free gift He gave thousands of years ago. You just have to allow yourself to receive the gift just as you are. You are worth it..."

When I read back over my message to my friend I couldn't help but hear Christ encouraging me as He was encouraging her through me.

"I am not enough".

These four words are the greatest deceptive lie whispered to me by the enemy because they can grip me in, in the worst way if I've gotten tripped up looking at my 'self'. All I can see and hear is "Shea, you're just not enough for ______." Oh

how it can break my heart, until by grace, the Lord reminds me, "You're right! In your 'self', you are not enough!" He may have reminded me of that truth when I directly turned to Him in how awful I felt or He may have used a fellow believer to remind me of His truths when I've reached out to them saying, "Help me. I can not 'see' Christ in me!"

The Enemy tries to pull us out of our heavenly sight and position in Christ by getting us to look at our flesh. If we sit and settle in that miserable place, then he has got a foothold in us. The Enemy wants us to look away from Christ and focus on how awful our flesh is then he gets to have his way in us. Thank God that our flesh is not the source of our identity. Christ is the source of our identity and He is enough in us--who we are in Christ is enough.

I have gotten to a place in my walk with the Lord where I am learning to trust His truths more and more by turning to Him more promptly. We can run in circles with the Enemy trying to make up ways for our flesh to be better, but it's dead. Our victory over the Enemy in the battle of feeling enough is to settle in our heart and spirit the truth that we are not enough in our 'self' and accept in our hearts that our value is in Christ. Any lie from the Enemy may be whispered to us over and over in different circumstances and situations; but, praise the Lord, we have the power of Christ within to simply turn away and leave the lie where it belongs-- in the

grave.

May the Lord continually give us grace to turn more immediately to Him and when we can't, may He give us grace to turn to a trusted believer to remind us of who we are in Him. It is *okay* for us to need to be reminded of the Lord's truths. We are not any less a believer in Christ if we turn to a fellow believer we trust to help us 'see' with spiritual eyes. Pride leads to no gain in Christ.

We live a dependent life on Christ in our individual walk with Him and an interdependent life through each other in the Body of Christ. It is a lie that we should be independent and that we do not need anyone. An independent mind will starve the Life of Christ inside us. There may be seasons in our walk with the Lord when we may not have any trusted believers to turn to. If this is a season the Lord has allowed, be encouraged because the Lord is *always* good and the Lord is *always* sufficient in where He has us. We must allow Christ to do the work He intends in us wherever we are.

And Jesus says to us, "Precious, precious believer, you are so worth it to me. There is NOTHING that can separate you from our Father's love. YOU ARE VALUED IN AND THROUGH my Life in you."

"Who dares accuse us whom God has chosen for his own? No one—for God himself has given us right standing with himself. Who then will

condemn us? No one-for Christ Jesus died for us and was raised to life for us, and he is sitting in the place of honor at God's right hand, pleading for us. Can anything ever separate us from Christ's love? Does it mean he no longer loves us if we have trouble or calamity, or are persecuted, or hungry, or destitute, or in danger, or threatened with death? (As the Scriptures say, "For your sake we are killed every day; we are being slaughtered like sheep.") No. despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who loved us. And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love. No power in the sky above or in the earth below-indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:33-39)
